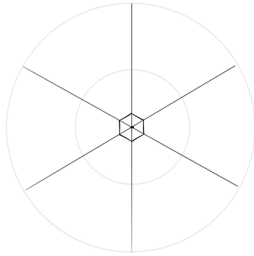


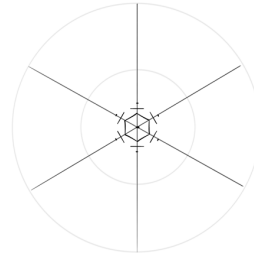
Snowflake Drawing

Each snowflake that falls from the sky is as unique in design as the prints on our fingers. Snowflakes are made of an intricate geometric design of ice. The intricate look of a snowflake can be recreated from simple, repetitive drawings. Following a rhythm can help you focus and guide your drawing. 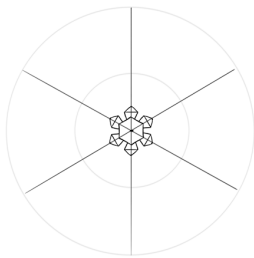
Step 1. On the reverse page, connect the lines in the center with a hexagon shape.



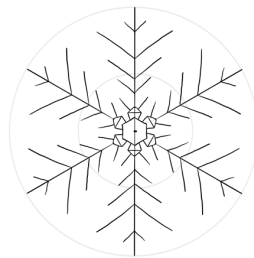
Step 2. Cross each line with a short horizontal line and a dot above it.



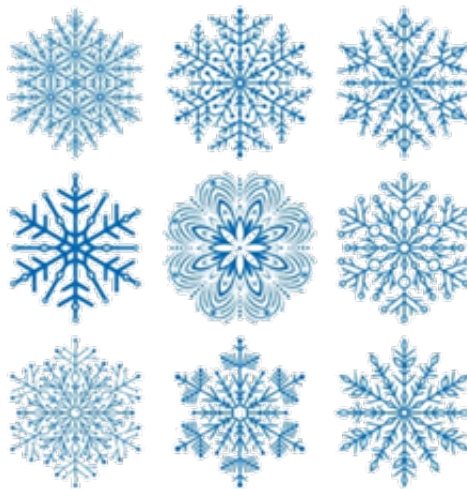
Step 3. Continue adding different shapes or lines to the rhythm of your music or your surroundings.



Step 4. Continue to add shapes or lines until you feel your snowflake is complete and unique.
